\* This assumes the student has completed the JWCSM AA Degree (or an AA Degree from some other school or college; or credits from a certification program), and has earned 60 previous college credits.

\*\* If the student completes both the JWCSM AA and BA majors — but has no other college credits — he or she could potentially be seven credits short. However, this is rare, since the average student enrolls in the BA program with 67 previous credits. Students can also earn up to 30 credits for life experiences, and from on-the-job certifications, professional certificates, etc. The truth is, many students graduate with *excess* credits on their transcripts. It is also important to note that other local colleges require up to 132 credits to graduate. But the JWCSM only requires 120, making it much easier for students to graduate.
